The prelude is built upon a chord progression and a syncopated arpeggio. I first played it as I was contemplating a beautiful picture of a deep canyon topped with some scattered clouds which resealed, as they floated by, a great expanse of starry sky. Wether the scene belonged to down or to dusk, to earth or to a distant planet, one could not tell. Nothing but silent tranquility emanated from it.

As I was playing, three variations eventually took shape ([A] [B] \& [C]), and I have kept them untouched to this day. The song differs with the premole in the same way as melody doeswith harmony or shape with texture. Like a flower among rocks, it offers a refreshing spell but leads ineluctably back into the deep connyon, topped with advancing clouds, starry sty behind.
